<u>Keyes</u>	<u>Issue</u>	<u>Obama</u>
<b><u>Pro-solution.</u></b> Keyes believes crime must be curtailed at its source—through strengthening the family—and also that sensible laws should be impartially enforced to discourage crime.	<i>Crime</i>	<b><u>Anti-solution.</u></b> Obama voted against bills to add extra penalties for gang-related crime, against making it a crime for accused gang members free on probation to associate with other gang members, and against prohibiting early release of sex offenders.
<b><u>Pro-clean-up.</u></b> Keyes is committed to cleaning up corruption in Illinois, as well as in the U.S. Senate, through diminishing the influence of powerful special interests.	<i>Corruption</i>	<b><u>Anti-clean-up.</u></b> Obama is supported by the Chicago Democratic machine. He votes with union bosses and is beholden to a long list of influential special interests.
<b><u>Pro-Second Amendment.</u></b> Keyes supports every citizen's right to defend themselves, their family, and their property.	<i>Second Amendment</i>	<b><u>Anti-gun.</u></b> Obama is an anti-gun extremist who even opposed legal protection for IL citizens who defend their homes and families from an intruder. (SB 2165)
<b><u>Pro-rule of law.</u></b> Keyes believes in adhering faithfully to the intent of our founding documents, and will fight tenaciously to prevent unelected federal judges from creating law from the bench.	<i>Rule of law</i>	<b><u>Anti-rule of law.</u></b> Obama rejects the intent of our founding documents and supports judges who usurp authority and ignore the will of the people as expressed through their elected representatives.
<b><u>Pro-law abiding.</u></b> Keyes believes in adhering faithfully to the intent of our founding documents, and will fight tenaciously to prevent unelected federal judges from creating law from the bench.	<i>Immigration</i>	<b><u>Anti-law abiding.</u></b> Obama's brand of "multicultural" liberalism causes him to be vague on the critical issue of illegal immigration, jeopardizing our country's security and strength.
<b><u>Pro-Bush policy.</u></b> Keyes supports President Bush's efforts in the war on terror, including the War in Iraq, and believes that the only way to deal with terrorism is to confront it directly and prevent it from striking again.	<i>War on terror</i>	<b><u>Anti-Bush policy.</u></b> Obama is critical of President Bush's war on terror and has said he doesn't support the war in Iraq. He sides with John Kerry's soft approach to terrorism.
<b><u>Pro-Israel.</u></b> Ambassador Keyes is an outspoken defender of Israel who believes America's special relationship with Israel is a moral obligation. He therefore believes Israel and America must remain strong allies in the war on terror.	<i>Israel</i>	<b><u>Pro-Arab interests.</u></b> Obama is critical of the Bush administration for not pressuring Israel to capitulate to "international" solutions to Palestinian terrorism. Obama's lack of experience in foreign policy would jeopardize U.S. interests.
